Reports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Chair: From your perspective, how do you feel CTE impacted 2018? What challenges do you foresee in 2019. How can CTE help to improve or navigate those areas?</li> <li><b>Business</b></li> <li>Hospitality: Struggling to find employees because kids are more active today.</li> <li>AV Communications: Many jobs require some college, for the writing components. Smaller, local companies have to compete with larger companies that can often offer more. Industry is strong.</li> <li>Government &amp; Public Admin.: Low unemployment. 2400 jobs recently created in Wichita – but workforce is needed to fill the spots. Talent is being exported out of the state.</li> <li>STEM: Most recent hires at Westar/Every are recruits from out of state. Finding and retaining workforce to work in the elements is a challenge. Diversity is also an issue.</li> <li>Construction: Business is strong. General contractors and subcontractors have enough business to be selective.</li> <li>Manufacturing: Low unemployment rate can stifle small businesses</li> <li>Education &amp; Training: Many non-traditional teachers hired. Mentoring programs in place. This pathway is currently being updated. Some schools don't have enough interest to have the pathway – Sharp concerns around standards and how they are implemented in classrooms and whether they are up to standards. Pay is also an issue.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Finance: Majority of workforce does not require degree. Look for soft skills: attitude. For promotion, a degree can be required. Many of the incoming workforce do not have personal financial skills. Don't hire this generation thinking they will have them for the long term.</li> <li>• Law/Public Safety: Not getting qualified applicants. Losing good candidates. Not seeing a lot of applicants that have been through the pathway.</li> <li>• Business Management: Good time to be in aviation. Good positions and jobs are available. Concern over equity in opportunities.</li> <li>• Human Services: Youth mental health first aid is a high priority. Looking into re-certification class availability.</li> </ul>	
Governance Structure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In progress – to help understand the committee</li> <li>• Keep members engaged</li> <li>• Create more value</li> <li>• <b>Suggestion: written updates rather than verbal</b></li> </ul>	<b>Conference Call or Zoom later to discuss the governance structure</b>
Reports	<p><b>Advisory Members</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BOE: It is important to provide the workforce that industries need – or they will leave. New governor put state BOE's budget in her budget – is getting pushback, but we will see what happens.</li> <li>• Jim Means: Working hard on aviation pathway. Andover, Maize, Wichita, Derby coming together for Advisory committees for the pathways. Huge teacher shortages.</li> <li>• Joni Clark-Leiker: IPS Roadshows on framework and career advising. The next will encompass business partnerships, career advisement, family engagement, work-based learning. Moodle training will hopefully be available in May. Always looking for alternative ways to deliver information at rural schools.</li> <li>• Eddie Estes: Workforce Summit begins tomorrow.</li> <li>• Cody Lee: Next KLCTE meeting is at February Conference. There is a need to be creative in how to reach all students and teach to their interests. Dual credit is a big incentive.</li> <li>• Max Heinrichs:</li> </ul>	
Incentivized Credentials/KPAC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As of next Monday, Peggy will move to a half-time position at KSDE until June 30.</li> <li>• Certifications on KPAC can be used to get pathway approved through KSDE.</li> <li>• Some certifications help to obtain completer status. They must be overarching the whole pathway. (ie: OSHA doesn't speak to construction skills)</li> <li>• Not all pathways are listed on the KPAC. Overarching certifications may not exist.</li> <li>• Excel in CTE: applies to certifications for high needs, high wage, high demand jobs. Students may receive tuition reimbursement (fees/tools not included) for dual credit courses. Currently operating at a \$4.3 million deficit. Changes will be coming on the list within the next year.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dual credit courses cause confusion for some schools, teachers – specifically requirements for teacher certification, grade on transcript, certification test requirements.</li> </ul>	
Perkins Transition Plan Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This year is a transition year. State Plan will be submitted in the spring. KSDE is working with KBOR to create the state plan.</li> <li>• Will be presented in February, March and April.</li> <li>• Perkins funding will now be able to be used on a brand new pathway.</li> <li>• Big focus on collaboration between secondary/postsecondary/business industry.</li> <li>• Also a focus on special populations</li> </ul>	
Work-Based Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• February Conference: There will be a presentation on Youth Registered Apprenticeship programs.</li> </ul>
