The average military student will attend six to nine different school systems from kindergarten through twelfth grade.

Purple is the color that symbolizes all branches of the military, as it is a combination of Army green, Coast Guard blue, Air Force blue, Marine red, and Navy blue. How many Kansas students have a parent currently in the military?

A check box in the **KIDS** record will identify a student having a parent who is an active duty military member. Currently in Kansas schools, **10,137** children have at least one parent currently serving in Active Duty Forces. This total does not include a few thousand children that have a parent serving in the National Guard or Reserves.

These numbers may not reflect youth who may have a brother or sister serving in the military, the stepchildren of military members, or children living with relatives while a parent in the military is deployed.
