Fewer kids in Ed/Training pathways.</p> <p>Jim – Openings in CTE. People applying are all from industry. It is challenging when programs are “a one man show.” New group HYPPE (Helping Young People Prepare for employment?) – Work on soft skills, employability skills. There has been an increase in enrollment going into the second year of aviation pathways.</p>

<p>KSDE CTE Updates</p>	<p>Peggy Torrens – 233 schools have construction pathways. 111 schools with manufacturing pathways. 63 schools with automotive pathways. Corrections/Fire – 7 years from 1 school to 47 schools – law and 37 – fire. 3 districts will start with aviation/production pathways next year. There is some conflict between Spirit/Textron with pathways and what should be taught.</p> <p>Wendy: Working on getting health science related presentations to the summer CTE conference (K-ACTE).</p> <p>Stacy – WBL Update – See attached packet.</p>
