Business & Industry Reports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students are using entry-level jobs, such as a bank teller, to move into higher level jobs.</li> <li>• Firefighting/Law/Public Safety: still struggling to find applicants</li> <li>• Construction: Construction companies looking for applicants that can be trained but have soft skills</li> <li>• Hospitality: labor shortages.</li> <li>• SB 155/Excel in CTE – in some colleges, high percentages of students in courses are high school students</li> <li>• Not all students have true interest in the subject area.</li> <li>• KSDE is actively involved in a research study with REL Central on CTE course-taking. Where are students years down the road?</li> <li>• Westar runs regularly with 100-125 job openings</li> <li>• Manufacturing: still struggling with finding employees. As employees move up the chain, it is sometimes hard to replace the lower levels.</li> </ul>	
Advisory Member Reports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• School Funding: State BOE. Recommended an additional \$90m. Has been signed by governor</li> <li>• May 9<sup>th</sup>, will go to the court to see if requirements are being met by this budget.</li> <li>• Bullying task force has been formed.</li> <li>• Apollo Redesign: Required only one school in a district rather than two.</li> <li>• 66 school districts committed to redesign</li> <li>• TEA has a lot of brand new members.</li> </ul>
