Incentivized Credentials/KPAC	 As of next Monday, Peggy will move to a half-time position at KSDE until June 30. Certifications on KPAC can be used to get pathway approved through KSDE. Some certifications help to obtain completer status. They must be overarching the whole pathway. (ie: OSHA doesn't speak to construction skills) Not all pathways are listed on the KPAC. Overarching certifications may not exist. Excel in CTE: applies to certifications for high needs, high wage, high demand jobs. Students may receive tuition reimbursement (fees/tools not included) for dual credit courses. Currently operating at a \$4.3 million deficit. Changes will be coming on the list within the next year.
