South Barber IEP teams utilize the Participation Guidelines provided by KSDE to identify students that qualify to participate in the alternate assessment. Through these guidelines, teams review each student's records to assess the disability or multiple disabilities that significantly impact their intellectual functioning and adaptive behavior. Records and current performance are reviewed to determine if students goals and instruction are linked to the enrolled grade level DLM Essential Elements. Also, it is determined if this student requires extensive direct individualized instruction and substantial support to achieve measurable gains in all grade and age appropriate curriculum. If all participation criterion questions are answered "yes" by the IEP team, then the student meets the criterion to be assessed using the alternate assessment (DLM).

What are the district's next steps to ensure that annually the appropriate test is administered to each student?

South Barber will continue to have test administrators attend any training given to review the participation guidelines in order to discuss with IEP team members when making the determination of participation in the alternate assessment (DLM). Any updates and changes that test administrators need to stay abreast with the alternate assessment information will be given each year. District will review results of each DLM participant on the DLM year-end report and determine that if a student has performed at "target" or "advanced" on both ELA and Math, they may need to be transitioned to the general assessment with appropriate accommodations.
