School Counselor

You must complete an approved graduate degree school counselor program to qualify for a School Counselor license

1. School Counselor Program

- a. Find which KS universities provide an approved school counselor program here: Directory App Progs Endorsements 02032021.pdf (ksde.org)
- b. Contact the Licensure Officer at your chosen university for entry requirements into the program and a plan of study.
 - i. You do not need to have a teaching background or teaching license to complete a school counselor program. If you do not have a teaching background, your plan of study will include some additional field experiences in schools.
- c. Progress through program coursework after formal acceptance by the university.
 - i. Must maintain a 3.25 cumulative GPA in program coursework.

2. Provisional License

- a. Available when 50% of the program coursework is completed AND
- b. A district verifies assignment in a counseling position
 - i. Can only be assigned under the <u>direct supervision of a school counselor</u> holding a Professional level school counselor license.
- c. Coordinate submission of the application with the Licensure Officer

3. Initial License

- a. Complete the program and earn degree
- b. Pass school counselor assessment
 - i. Find current required school counselor assessment here: <u>Praxis: Kansas:</u> <u>Test Requirements (ets.org)</u> (click on Instructional Support Personnel)
- c. Coordinate submission of the application with the Licensure Officer

4. Professional license

a. Complete a year-long approved mentor program during first year of employment as a school counselor during the Initial license to upgrade to the Professional level license.
