All elementary schools have been separated into four equal quartiles based on the percentage of "Free and Reduced Lunch" students. The "high poverty" category represents $25 \%$ of the elementary buildings in the state and has $68.48 \%$ or more students qualifying for free and reduced meals, while the "low poverty" category represents $25 \%$ of the elementary buildings in the state which have less than $37.13 \%$ of the students qualifying for free and reduced meals.

All secondary schools have been separated into four equal quartiles based on the percentage of "Free and Reduced Lunch" students. The "high poverty" category represents $25 \%$ of the secondary buildings in the state and has $58.33 \%$ or more students qualifying for free and reduced meals, while the "low poverty" category represents $25 \%$ of the secondary buildings in the state which have less than $31.39 \%$ of the students qualifying for free and reduced meals.
