How many Kansas students have a parent currently in the military?

A check box in the KIDS record will identify a student having a parent who is an active duty military member. Currently in Kansas schools, 10,177 children have at least one parent currently serving in Active Duty Forces. In addition, 2,666 children have a parent serving in the National Guard or Reserves. These numbers may not reflect youth who have siblings in the military, the stepchildren of military members, or children living with relatives while a parent is deployed.

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
