




Reading Trends – All Students 2003-2010



Mathematics Trends – All Students 2003-2010







AYP Based on NCLB

- No Child Left Behind
- Most recent reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)
- Scheduled to expire in 2013-2014 school year
- Reauthorization anticipated by August 2011

Blueprint for Reform

(Released March 2010)

- 1. College-and career-ready students
- 2. Great teachers & great leaders in every school
- 3. Equity & opportunity for all students
- 4. Raise the bar and reward excellence
- 5. Promote innovation & continuous improvement

Common Core Standards

- In English/language arts and mathematics
 - Developed in collaboration with 48 states, teachers, administrators and experts
 - Evidence based and internationally benchmarked
 - Include content and application of knowledge
 - Fewer, higher, clearer
- Fully implemented by August 2014

Next Generation Assessments

SMARTER/Balanced Consortium

- 31 states
- Won't be all multiple choice
- Performance based
- Computer adaptive
- More emphasis on formative assessments

Higher Education Partnership

 Students meeting cut scores in math and English language arts allowed automatic entry to credit bearing postsecondary courses in these content areas



Growth Model



- Accountability measured progress over time
- Applies to individual students, schools, districts and the state

P-20 Council

Established by Governor Sebelius in 2008 by Executive Order



What We Learned

- A *high school diploma is not sufficient* to compete in the current or future workforce.
- Consensus building among the many groups involved in addressing the individual stages of the educational process is vitally important.
- *Education is not linear* in what many would consider the traditional approach to education; i.e., K-12 to postsecondary to work.
