

## Transporting Students with Disabilities & Preschoolers

### 2013 KSPTA Special Needs Team Safety Rodeo Knowledge Test

This is an open book test to be completed by the team members who are entered in the 2013 Rodeo competition. The purpose of this test is to measure and increase your knowledge of transporting students with disabilities and preschoolers.
