National Board Certification Incentive Bonus Application sent on listserv April 3

Funds have been appropriated for 2023-2024 to *reimburse school districts* for the National Board Certification incentive bonus under K.S.A. <u>72-2166</u> as follows:

- A teacher employed by a Kansas school district who has attained National Board certification shall be paid an incentive bonus of \$1,000.
 The bonus is paid each school year as long as the teacher remains employed by a Kansas school district and retains a valid master teacher's certificate.
- The bonus shall be paid by the employing school district, but the school district this year is entitled to receive state aid under the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certification Incentive Program equal to the amount of any bonuses paid.
- The state aid is to be deposited in the school district general fund and treated as a reimbursement.

In order to claim the reimbursement, districts must file an application with the Department of Education no later than April 30, 2023. Download the National Board Certification Incentive Bonus Application under the "What's New" page on the School Finance website: http://www.ksde.org/Agency/Fiscal-and-AdministrativeServices/School-Finance/Whats-New.

The National Board Certification payment will direct deposit approximately May 15 to reimburse districts for incentive bonuses for eligible National Board Certified teachers.
