How many Kansas students have a parent currently in the military?

A check box in the KIDS record will identify a student having a parent who is an activeduty military member. Currently in Kansas schools, **9,989** children have at least one parent currently serving in Active-Duty Forces. This total does not include a few thousand children that have a parent serving in the National Guard or Reserves.

These numbers may not reflect youth who have may have a brother or sister serving in the military, the stepchildren of military members, or children living with relatives while a parent in the military is deployed.
