



Kansas Benchmark Assessment – Novice Low Presentational

1. **Write an essay** on the topic “all about me.”* Students write short paragraphs of approximately 5 sentences on each familiar topic for a total of 200-250 words maximum. Topics to include are:
 - Basic description: name, age, appearance
 - Family and pets, including pertinent descriptions
 - Hobbies, interests, activities
 - Favorite or least favorite clothing
 - Favorite or least favorite foods
 - School subjects, routines, etc.
 - Where I live

*Give the assignment an appropriate target language title. German example: “Das bin ich!” Student turns in first draft of the essay. Use a peer review activity, with each reader focusing on a specific section of the rubric (see below). Teacher reviews and makes suggestions, then returns it to the student to make changes.

Student improves the essay based on peer and teacher feedback, following the rubric.

2. Use the “all about me” essay to create a “Big Book” or a PowerPoint **presentation**.
 - Minimum of one page/slide per topic.
 - Each page of the book must include a graphic depiction of the topic, either a drawing, a photo, or clip art and the text in a large font.
 - PowerPoint presentation will be graphic depiction with a title. The text will go into the slide ‘notes’.
 - Either type of presentation needs a title page/slide.

Presentations can be read from text/notes in order to be polished and fluent

Logistical notes:

- Presentations can be made in small groups and/or recorded on video.
- Members of the audience can be assigned a listening task during presentations. Students can alternate between using the rubric and using a checklist of information included in the presentation. For added interest, invite each student to incorporate one lie or one illogical detail within a topic. The listener must correctly identify the discrepant detail.
