Deposit KPERS in Code 51

The 2nd quarter **KPERS payment** (deposits Monday, October 17) is required to be deposited in the KPERS Special Retirement Contribution Fund (Code 51). Deposit as revenue (Line 05-3221) and record as an expenditure broken out by function code as outlined in Code 51 of the USD budget. Kansas law requires school districts to record this as a revenue and an expenditure. KPERS will withdraw these funds from your account on the day it is received or the first working day thereafter.

Deposit Special Education in General fund and transfer

Special Education state aid will direct deposit on Monday, October 17. As you will recall, the law requires all special education state aid payments to be deposited in the school district's general fund budget (Code 06, Line 120 – 3205 Special Education Aid). The revenue would then be transferred from the general fund to the special education fund (Code 30, Line 75 – 5206 Transfer from General).

Detail reports are posted online. To view payment amounts and print the special education detail reports, link <u>here</u>. Select **FY23 Special Education State Aid Printout**. If a security warning appears in a yellow bar above the spreadsheet, click on **Enable Content** to proceed.

Next, with your cursor, locate **Cell F3** (in red) and click on the arrow to scroll up and select your LEA number. The information will refresh when the LEA number is updated. To display each report, select a tab located at the bottom of the screen (Special Ed, Coop Split, Payment Received).

Quarterly reporting is now open on <u>CommonApp</u>. Every school district will need to submit an Expenditure Report by the end of the day on 10/21/2022.

When submitting your Excel, please update the narrative with how ESSER funds were spent this past quarter. If you did not have any expenditures, you can upload the last quarter spreadsheet with an updated date on the Instructions and Totals tab and add "No expenditures" in the narrative section. Please note, we will need more than "NA" and "see spreadsheet" for the response when expenditures have been updated. This report is cumulative and will need to have all ESSER expenditures previously spent plus the new expenditures this quarter.

Be sure that you are not using (-) negatives on the Excel. If you need to reduce or remove something, do so in the original allocation line.

Do not use the object codes 564, 565, or 590 anywhere on the quarterly reporting Excel.

Transportation-related statutes

Headlight Law – share with all students and staff who drive.

K.S.A. 8-1703 states that all vehicles on Kansas highways will drive with headlights:

- from sunset to sunrise;
- due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric conditions on the highway, including smoke or fog;
- when windshield wipers are in continuous use as a result of rain, sleet or snow;
- and motorcycles shall display head and tail lights at all times when operated on any highway.

No texting while driving - <u>K.S.A. 8-15,111</u> prohibits a person who is operating a motor vehicle on a public road or highway from "texting," using a wireless communications device to write, send, or read a written communication. This bill defines "wireless communications device" to include any type of device that sends or receives messages, but to exclude voice-operated devices.

School Bus age limit - <u>K.S.A. Supp. 8-2009a</u> placed a limit on the age of all school buses of <u>25</u> years from the date of manufacture of such school bus.

Activity Trips (School & Activity Buses) – K.A.R. 91-38-9(e) requires bus drivers to provide an explanation regarding the location and operation of the emergency exits on the bus prior to each activity trip.

12-15 passenger vans shall not be used to transport students - K.S.A.72-64,100 prohibits the use of 12 -15 passenger vans by public and nonpublic schools for transporting students. If transporting more than 10 passengers in addition to the driver, school districts shall transport such students in a school bus.

Commercial Driver's License holders - diversion agreements not allowed – <u>K.S.A. 8-2,150</u> prohibits the holder of a CDL from entering into a diversion agreement for any traffic offenses, with the exception of parking violations, regardless of the type of vehicle they are driving when the offense occurred.


