

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
Bachelor of Arts/Science Degree with an emphasis in Pre Law

THIS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT is between any Kansas high school student who has successfully completed a state approved Law, Public Safety, Corrections & Security Career Cluster and the Corrections, Security, Law, & Law Enforcement – Pre-Law Strand Pathway and Emporia State University, Emporia, Kansas. It will provide students with a smooth transition from high school to a postsecondary program/degree in Political Science or Public Administration or Pre Law. The intent of this cooperative effort is to provide the students with a non-duplicative program of study leading to enhanced employment opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:


1. The secondary student will attain concentrator status through successful completion of his/her high school Corrections, Security, Law, & Law Enforcement – Pre-Law Strand Pathway sequence of courses.
2. Emporia State University will provide the courses listed on the attached program of Study/Courses Sequence form.
3. The Bachelor of Arts/Science degree with an emphasis in Pre-Law may be granted through the Emporia State University joint agreement. The awarding of such a degree is contingent upon the graduation high school's continuance of their KSDE approved Career Cluster Pathway.
4. Successful completion of the following Corrections, Security, Law, & Law Enforcement – Pre-Law Strand Career Cluster Pathway course(s) will result in the student being awarded college credit for the following equivalent course(s):

5. Postsecondary Credit will be considered Advanced Placement Credit, and will be awarded upon submission to the college of the student's high school transcript.

6. Details regarding credit awards and fees are outlined below:
 - a. College credit will only be awarded for a grade of "C" or better in the required high school course(s).
 - b. No fee will be assessed for the college credit awarded.
 - c. Student must declare Political Science or Public Administration or Pre Law as their major area of interest.
7. To receive a Bachelor of Arts Degree, students must complete a minimum of 120 hours of coursework, including 15 credit hours of related content as outlined in the program of study. Students must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better to be eligible for a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Emporia State University.
8. To receive a Bachelor of Science Degree with an emphasis in Pre Law, students must complete a minimum of 120 hours of coursework. Students must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better to be eligible for a Bachelor of Science Degree from Emporia State University.
9. The college and any high school offering the approved Career Cluster Pathway may advertise the programs and will jointly advise the students that this option is available to them.
10. This agreement may be revised/modified as needed, or in the event of cancellation, discontinuance or disapproval of any course or program by the Kansas State Department of Education or the Kansas Board of Regents.
11. The college agrees to evaluate this program on an annual basis and in the context of student benefits, program efficiency, and effectiveness.
12. This agreement shall begin January 1, 2014.
13. This agreement is subject to change or cancellation by the Legislature at any time in accordance with Article 6, Section 5 of the Kansas Constitution.
