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
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Kansas Seal of Biliteracy 2020-2021

State Results


STUDENTS WHO EARNED THE KANSAS SEAL OF BILITERACY 587 students



- Since its adoption, 1,889 students have earned the Seal of Biliteracy.
- The 2020-2021 increase in participation is the biggest increase since the initiative was adopted in 2016 by the Kansas State Board of Education.
- Approximately 160 languages other than English are spoken in students' homes in Kansas.

- There are 286 school districts in Kansas
- Forty districts (one out of seven) participated this year, a new benchmark.
- A total of 53 districts have participated since the adoption of the initiative in 2016.

The percentage of students whose first language is not English varies greatly in districts across the state. Some districts report not having any students whose first language is not English. In some districts the percentage of students who are emerging bilinguals is 50%. The national average for English L2 learners earning the Seal is approximately 25%.
