<p>V. Old Business</p>	<p>Monitoring Visit Update and School Compliance</p>	<p>Sill working on this. Gary will have more information at next meeting.</p>
<p>VI. New Business</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Schools DF reports overall about 10 new virtual schools for 21-22. He wants to remind everyone of the requirement for all virtual programs to transition to a school before August 1. • Virtual Mentor Plan: Gary explained the importance of having established virtual directors' mentor new directors. David agrees that the common goal is to educate Kansas children and what best suits the needs of the child. Pairing new directors with a mentor who shares same demographic needs (learning program, attendance, etc.) could increase the plan's success. While Advisory Council Leadership wants everyone in the council to mentor, it is not mandatory. • Virtual Count Days: Reminder that there are 2 count dates for virtual schools. <i>Q: Why are there 2 count dates?</i> <i>A: For accountability. Legislature wants to make sure schools aren't counting the same student as virtual on the first count date and again as a brick/mortar student a week later.</i> • SPED Guidance: Complaints and concerns increased this school year, specifically about kids in special education being denied for virtual school. The language from the current screening process can put schools at higher risk of being sued so the guidance is being re-written. There is going to be a live webinar this summer and SPED and Virtual directors are highly encouraged to attend. We need their feedback to make the guidance as accurate as possible. • Districts Offering virtual learning at a reduced rate (not service centers): Be very careful about finding ways to 'save money'. If Legislature sees that allotted funds are not being spend down, they can reduce the budget for virtual funding. • Virtual Learning Conference: KSDE and KLN are partnering with Greenbush to hold a virtual conference in Feb 2022. It will be held in person (registration cap) and online.
