

Kansas State Performance Plan: Indicator 12: Early Childhood Transition Part C to Part B

What is Indicator 12?

Indicator 12 is a compliance indicator that measures the percent of children referred by Part C prior to age 3, who are found eligible for Part B, and who have an IEP developed and implemented by their third birthdays. 20 U.S.C. § 1416(a)(3)(B).

Regulatory Requirement: According to 20 U.S.C. § 1412(a)(1)(A) and 34 C.F.R. § 300.101(b), the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE) must ensure that – (1) a free appropriate public education is available to each eligible child residing in Kansas begins no later than the child's third birthday and (2) an individualized education program (IEP) or an individual family service plan (IFSP) is in effect for the child by that date, in accordance with 34 C.F.R § 300.323(b). If a child's third birthday occurs during the summer, the child's IEP team shall determine the date when services under the IEP or IFSP will begin.

What is the data source for Indicator 12?

KDHE submits and uploads data fields from the Part C database into a secure site at KSDE annually. A file is generated by KSDE and is uploaded into KSDE authenticated website KIAS along with data submitted by districts and is tabulated using the KSDE authenticated website, KIAS. The KIAS runs verification checks specifically designed to find errors in the data and student data that needs follow-up. The KIAS calculates the measurement variables for Indicator 12.

Where can I find the Indicator 12 data that KSDE collects and reports to the U.S. Department of Education?
