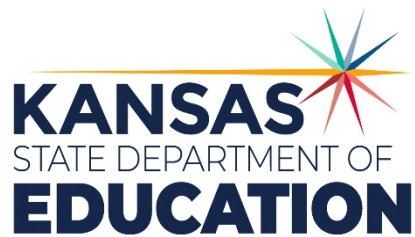

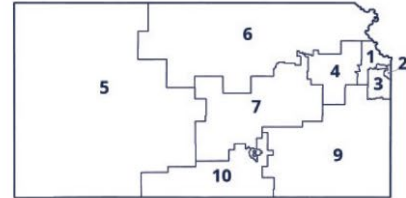

This data is compiled from information submitted by each district on the Superintendent's Organization Report (SO66).

Enrollment

September 20 and February 20 full-time equivalency (FTE) enrollment (includes Preschool-Aged At-Risk (4-Years Old) and special education 3-, 4- and 5-years old).

Starting in 2021-2022, Preschool-Aged At-Risk (3-years old) were funded in addition to Preschool-Aged At-Risk (4-years old), therefore, Preschool-Aged At-Risk (3-years old) are also included in enrollment starting in 2021-2022.

Pupil-Teacher Ratio

Enrollment ÷ PK-12 Teachers = Pupil-Teacher Ratio
