Column Explanations

Total Certified Employees:

All certified personnel, calculated at full-time equivalency (FTE). This includes superintendents, associate/assistant superintendents, administrative assistants, principals, assistant principals, directors/supervisors of special education, directors/supervisors of health, directors/supervisors of vocational education, instructional coordinators/ supervisors, all other directors/supervisors, other curriculum specialists, practical arts/ vocational teachers, special education teachers, pre-kindergarten teachers, kindergarten teachers, all other teachers, library media specialists, school counselors, clinical or school psychologists, nurses, speech pathologists, audiologists, school social work services, reading specialists/teachers, and others.

Special Education Teachers:

Includes special education teachers, calculated at full-time equivalency.

PK-12 Teachers:

This includes practical arts/vocational teachers, kindergarten teachers, pre-kindergarten teachers, reading specialists/teachers, and all other teachers, calculated at full-time equivalency.

Enrollment:

September 20 and February 20 full-time equivalency (FTE) enrollment (includes 4 year old at risk and special education 3-4-5 year old). Beginning the 2015-16 school year, the February 20 count date no longer applies.

Pupil-Teacher Ratio:

Enrollment divided by PK-12 Teachers (Enrollment ÷ PK-12 Teachers)
