St. George and Westmoreland Elementary Schools have re-organized around multi-age/continuous progress teams with a curriculum that is implemented through thematic instruction. Achievement, not chronological age, drives instruction in these schools.

Rock Creek Jr. Sr. High provides a comprehensive academic program with advanced placement courses in core academic areas. Block scheduling allows teachers time to infuse hands-on projects into the curriculum with a strong emphasis on the integration of technology into the curriculum.

The District's Accomplishments and Challenges

Accomplishments:

In 2008 and 2009, Rock Creek achieved the state Standard of Excellence on 22 out of 22 math and reading tests and each school received the Governor's Achievement Award for scoring in the top 5% in the state for both reading and math.

In 2009, SGES won the Kansas Challenge Award, which is bestowed upon only 10 schools and recognizes high achievement in spite of challenging obstacles like high numbers of free/reduced lunch students. Also in 2009, RCJSHS received the National Blue Ribbon Award and was the only high school in the state of Kansas to be nominated! This U.S. Department of Education award honors high student achievement and is the highest award a school can win in the U.S. Only 33 high schools and 11 middle schools in the nation were named Blue Ribbon Schools in 2009.

In 2010, SGES won the National Blue Ribbon Award and the Governor's Achievement Award, which recognizes the top 5% of schools in math and reading achievement. WES has won the Governor's Achievement Award three times in the last four years.

Our use of multi-age classrooms and cross-subject themes at the elementary level and a wide variety of innovative classes and programs at the secondary level have led to our school district mentoring several others in order to share our formula for success.

Challenges:

Our primary challenge will likely be creating more space at RCJSHS when it's needed. Ongoing growth at SGEs will likely lead to an eventual shortage of space at that building and a proposed bio research lab (NBAF) in Manhattan could create a large and acute need for additional space at either of those schools. In 2008, a new SGEs was built. In 2012, an additional bond issue was passed, which will build 1-2 preplanned additions in that building and three classrooms at RCJSHS. Other facility projects include an upstairs restroom at WES, resurfaced parking lots at all schools, bleacher additions and renovations at RCJSHS, a strength and conditioning building at RCJSHS, a new roof at WES, a resurfaced track at RCJSHS, and new carpeting at WES and RCJSHS. Due to steady growth in and around St. George, additional classroom space and other facility improvements will likely be needed within the next decade.

Like other Kansas school districts, recent cuts in funding have endangered our ability to provide the best service possible for our students and patrons. Since our school district has one of the lowest local property taxes (LOB) in the state we have raised our LOB this year to partially compensate for funding reductions. Further funding cuts, however, could lead to challenges regarding student achievement and personnel recruitment and retention.
