State-Level Four- and Five-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates for 2010-2011

The 2010-2011 four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate formula is as follows:

$$\frac{\# \text{ 2011 graduates (\# of cohort members earning a regular HS diploma by Sept. 30, 2011)}}{\# \text{ 1st time 9th graders in fall 2007 plus transfers in minus students who transfer out, emigrate, or die during 2010-2011, 2009-2010, 2008-2009 and 2007-2008}} \times 100\% = \text{rate}$$

The 2010-2011 five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate formula is as follows:

$$\frac{\# \text{ 2011 graduates (\# of cohort members earning a regular HS diploma by Sept. 30, 2011)}}{\# \text{ 1st time 9th graders in fall 2006 plus transfers in minus students who transfer out, emigrate, or die during 2010-2011, 2009-2010, 2008-2009, 2007-2008 and 2006-2007}} \times 100\% = \text{rate}$$

Note: The table below shows two different cohorts that graduated in 2011. The four-year cohort began in 2008 and the five-year cohort started in 2007.

**Four-Year and Five-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates for 2010-2011**

| Student Group                    | Four-Year Rate (2008-2011) | Five-Year Rate (2007-2011) |
|----------------------------------|----------------------------|----------------------------|
| All Students                     | 83.0%                      | 82.1%                      |
| Students with Disabilities       | 73.6%                      | 71.8%                      |
| Free/Reduced Lunch               | 73.2%                      | 72.2%                      |
| Hispanic                         | 73.2%                      | 72.9%                      |
| White                            | 86.1%                      | 85.5%                      |
| Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander | 78.6%                      | 78.7%                      |
| Black or African American        | 72.4%                      | 69.0%                      |
| Asian                            | 88.3%                      | 89.0%                      |
| American Indian/Alaskan Native   | 72.4%                      | 71.9%                      |
| Multi-Racial                     | 80.8%                      | 73.6%                      |
